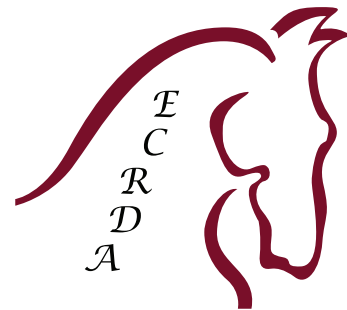

**Competitors Exempt from
USDF/USEF Membership/Non-Membership Fees and Horse Registration**

Individuals competing only in USDF Introductory, Pas de Deux, Quadrille or Opportunity classes are EXEMPT from USDF/USEF membership/non-membership fees, horse identification number requirements, and USEF drugs and medication fees. However, horses entered in these classes are still subject to and must comply with D&M rules and are subject to testing at the competition. Cross entry to other classes is allowed, but then all applicable fees and membership requirements apply.

Entries:

- Completed entries must be mailed to the Show Secretary and must be **RECEIVED** by the closing date and will be processed in order received.
- Do not send entries by registered or certified mail. No telephone, fax or e-mail entries accepted.
- **All INCOMPLETE entries will be surcharged a \$25 handling fee. Illegible entries are not accepted.**
- No competitor will be allowed to compete in the show unless all fees are paid in full.
- **POST ENTRIES** (received after closing date or after the show is filled) will be placed on a waiting list to fill scratches at the Secretary's discretion.
- **One Horse & Rider Combination per Entry Form**
- All entries must be typed or printed on a 2020 Region 1 entry form (may be copied) and MUST include:
 - **ORIGINAL HANDWRITTEN SIGNATURES: Owner, Rider and Trainer** (Coach, if applicable). Photocopied signatures are **NOT** acceptable.
 - **PHOTOCOPY OF NEGATIVE COGGINS** dated within a year of the show date.
 - **PHOTOCOPY PROOF OF VACCINATION: Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis)** vaccinations within six months prior to the date of the show (USEF GR845).
 - **COPY OF USEF & USDF MEMBERSHIP CARDS FOR HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER.**
 - **USEF MEMBERSHIP CARD FOR TRAINER** and coach if applicable.
 - **EMERGENCY CONTACT NAME & PHONE NUMBER**
 - Checks made payable to "ECRDA"

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Make sure to designate your ride as GAIG Q where applicable!

Refunds:

- Refunds before closing date minus \$30 office fee.
- No refunds on stabling. After the show begins, there will be no refund of entry fees if classes need to be cancelled due to Acts of God, weather, and/or terrorism.

Rules:

- Management reserves the right to cancel/combine classes or change judges at its discretion.
- Ribbons through sixth place awarded for each class. Prizes for first place if three or more entries per class.
- Bridle numbers must be worn at all times when on the show grounds.

Scheduling & Ride Times:

- Special time requests will be entertained but cannot be guaranteed.
- Tentative starting times available at **www.ecrda.com** as soon as schedule is finalized, but no later than three days prior to show. Schedule will be considered final by 12 noon the day before show.

Musical Freestyles:

Freestyle class entries require a copy of the qualifying test at that level to be submitted at time of entry. Riders should submit music to the announcer's booth the morning of their ride. Music should be labeled with instructions and horse/rider names. Sound Checks will be arranged during the ring breaks.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Dogs are NOT permitted anywhere on the showgrounds.

Protective Headgear: Please refer to the protective headgear requirements for Dressage per the current USEF Rule Book, sections DR120.6 and GR801. It is the competitor's responsibility to wear the correct headgear.

Footing: **Outdoor Standard Arena** (60x20): blue stone and sand. **Indoor Standard Arena** (60x20): sand/rubber footing. **Lunging Area:** enclosed grass/dirt paddock near the indoor arena. **Grass Surrounding Arena:** Competitors can feel free to warmup prior to their ride in the grass near the outdoor arena - please do not ride behind the judge's booth during a competition ride!!!

Stabling: Stabling will not be available at this time. Very sorry for this inconvenience!

Sharps Container: Sharps container will be available near Secretary's stand, in the main barn. The Safety Coordinator is Eileen Keller, (732) 569-1542.

Non-Competes: Pay office fee and non-compete fee, submit entry form and negative coggins.

Professional Services: Contact numbers will be posted in the secretary's stand. EMT on site; Vet and Farrier will be on call.

Food: Food and drink will be available on the day of the show.

Emergency plan: Emergency plan, with phone numbers, will be posted at the Secretary's stand and in the barns.

Minors Driving Motorized Vehicles:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- Submit two CDs of your music clearly labeled with your name, horse's name, bridle number, and freestyle level.
- Be present for your sound check.
- Know the rules for the level you are riding. This includes forbidden and allowed movements for your level.

ADULT AMATEUR: Adult Amateur riders must be registered as such with USEF and must enclose a copy of their current USEF membership card.

JR./YR.: Individuals are eligible to enter as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible to enter as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 21. Competitors shall compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. (DR 19.3). Riders who are 16 and 17 years old may compete as either Juniors or Young Riders. Birth date must be noted in designated spot on entry form.

HORSE AGE: Horses under 36 months of age may not be ridden in any dressage under-saddle class.

GAIG: If entering any GAIG/USDF Qualifying class, please enclose additional \$15 fee for each qualifying ride in classes marked "GAIG/USDF Q". Also, please note that all riders must have a USDF Participating Membership, while owners may have a USDF Participating Membership or USDF Business Membership. Horse must have USDF Lifetime registration number and USEF Annual or Lifetime membership.

BLM: Results of these classes will be used to qualify horse/rider combinations for the Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championships. Riders must be members of a USDF GMO at the time of the show to qualify.

USDF HORSE NUMBERS: USDF requires all horses competing in USDF recognized competitions to have a Horse Identification Number (HID) for the purpose of tracking scores. The cost of this number is \$35 and is a onetime fee. If your horse is Lifetime Registered with USDF, that number is your HID. Competitors are urged to acquire this number prior to competition if possible. A form is available on the USDF website.

USEF HORSE NUMBERS: USEF requires all competing horses to have an identification (ID) number. An agreement has been reached between USDF and USEF to share HID numbers, however, you must first acquire the number from USDF at a cost of \$35 before the number can be shared by USEF. Horses not fully registered with USDF and USEF will not be eligible to participate in the GAIG/USDF Regional Championships.

High Score Awards

American Connemara Pony Society (ACPS): Horse must be registered. Please submit papers.

American Hanoverian Society (AHS): Submit a copy of papers - if no papers, horse must be branded.

American Morgan Horse Association (AMHA): Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

American Warmblood Society & Sporthorse Registry (AWSSR): Awarded to the highest scoring AWS horse in competition; must submit a copy of papers & provide proof of membership.

Friesian Horse Association of North America (FHANA): Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

Friesian Sporthorse Association (FSA): Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

International Andalusian & Lusitano Horse Association (IALHA): Horses must be registered & owners must be current year members. Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

International Rescue Horse Registry: Horse must be registered; Registry will register horse over the phone during the competition & can be reached at (757) 876-3272.

ISR/OLD-NA: Submit a copy of papers & proof of owner's current year membership with entry.

KWPN-NA: Horses must be registered KWPN and be on file in the KWPN-NA office, owners must be the "Owner of Record" on the registration papers. Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

North American Danish Warmblood Association (NADWA): Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry. Owner & Horse MUST be current year members. Winner will receive a certificate to be mailed to NADWA for actual High Score Award.

Norwegian Fjord Registry: Submit copy of papers; owner and exhibitor must be current year members.

Thoroughbred Incentive Program (TIP): Submit a copy of papers & a copy of the TIP card. There will be a Young Thoroughbred HS Award (any TIP horse in its first 2 years of showing), a Training Level HS Award, a Second Level HS Award & an Overall HS Award.

RPSI: Submit a copy of papers & proof of current year membership with entry.

Westfalen Horse Association: Horse must be registered.

Mature Horse High Score Award (Calumet Run): Horse must be at least 17 years of age or older to qualify.

Grassroots Adult Amateur High Score Award (Screaming Eagle Farm): AA that has not shown above 3rd level or achieved their USDF Bronze Medal.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

or

b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2020 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2020 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

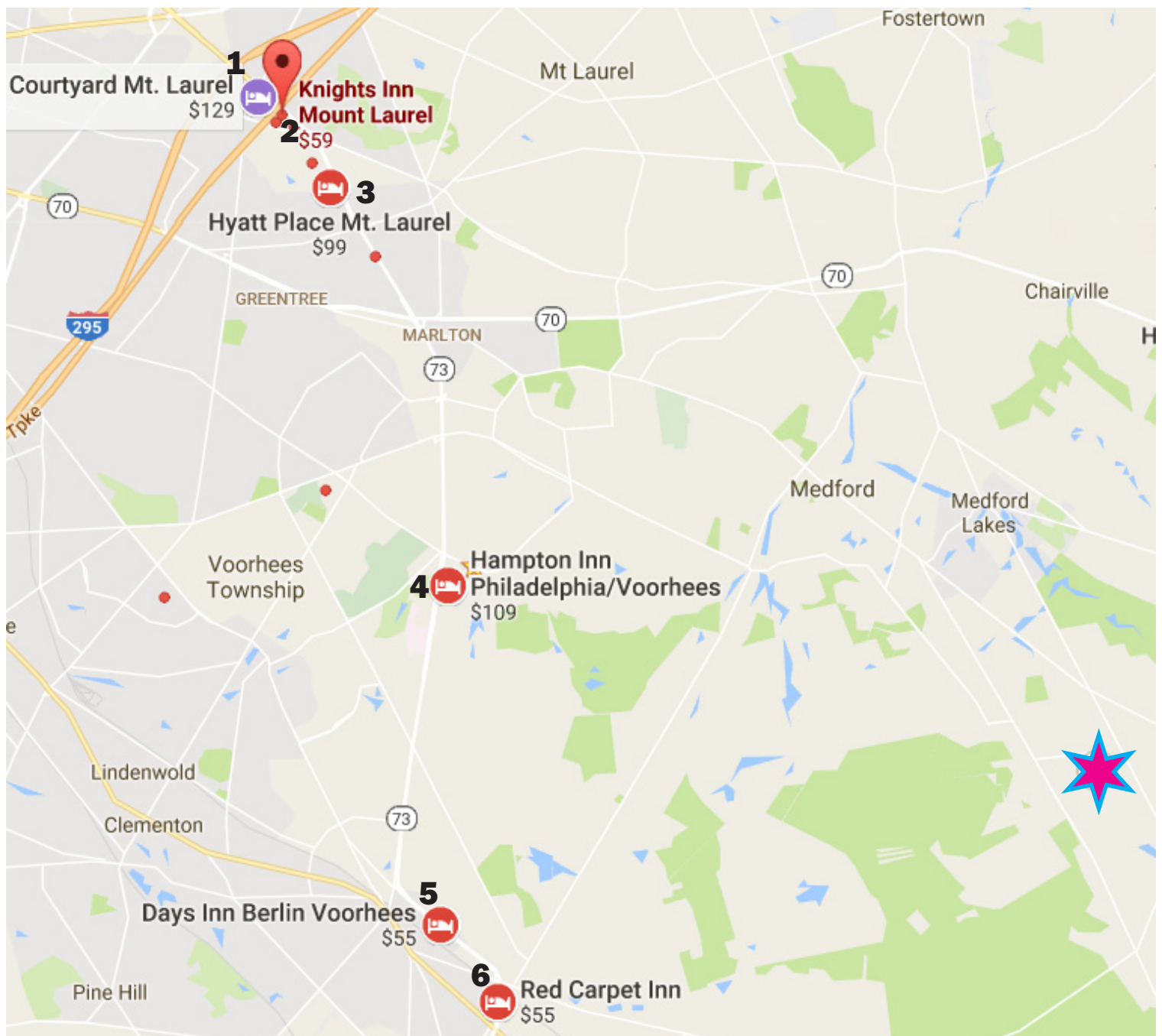

FROM THE NORTH

New Jersey Turnpike, Exit 7

Take Route 206 south through Columbus, Vincentown, and past the Red Lion Circle. It will take about 15 minutes to the Circle from the Turnpike. After the Circle, you'll go about another two miles. At the second light (after the circle), you'll see the Tabernacle Inn, a restaurant on your left side. It's a two story pinkish building. The intersecting road at the light is the Medford Lakes Road. Turn right onto Medford Lakes Road. Go to the second street on the left, Oakshade Road. Turn left onto Oakshade Road. Go about 2 miles to a red blinking light. There will be a Wawa on the corner. Turn right at the blinker onto Indian Mills Road. You'll pass a school on your left. Shortly thereafter, you'll come to Grassy Lake Road on your left. Turn left onto Grassy Lake Road. Go about a mile to an intersection. Go across at the stop sign staying on Grassy Lake Road. Proceed about 1 mile. On your left will be the entrance to the Saddlebrook Ridge development. Turn left into the development. Take the next left onto Saddlebrook Court. Officials may head straight to the barn. Others follow signs for trailer parking.

Route 295 South to Route 70 East

Take Route 295 to Route 70 East. Stay on 70 East at the MARLTON CIRCLE and go about 5 miles to Medford. When you enter Medford Township you'll see shopping centers on both sides of the road. When you see the Medford Ford get into the right lane. As soon as you go around the bend you will make a right turn onto Main Street. Main Street is also called Route 541 South. Once you pass through the town itself, it is called Stokes Road. As soon as you turn onto Main Street set your odometer to zero. Proceed on 541 South for 6.5 miles. USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program Guidelines for Competitors

The USEF/USDF Dressage Seat Medal Program (DSM), for riders ages 18 and under, celebrates excellence in equitation and strives to develop a solid foundation for future success in the dressage arena.

Riders wishing to qualify for the [USEF Dressage Seat Medal Finals](#) must compete in the [USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals](#) held at the [Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships](#). The top two riders in each DSM Semi-Finals class will qualify to advance to the annual USEF DSM Finals. In case one of the top two riders in either DSM Semi-Finals class does not compete in the Finals, the third placed rider in the respective class will be allowed to compete (DR 133.2 (c)).

To qualify for the USDF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals, a competitor must earn a qualifying score of 70% or above in any eligible [Dressage Seat Equitation](#) class (except walk/trot) held at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition during the qualifying period or must qualify for the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championships.

RIDER, OWNER AND HORSE MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- **FOR COMPETING IN A DRESSAGE SEAT EQUITATION CLASS**
 - Rider - must have a USDF Group or Participating Membership (GM or PM) at the time of the qualifying ride.
 - Owner - must meet minimum competition eligibility requirements.
 - Horse - must have either a USDF Horse Identification Number (HID) or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) at the time of the qualifying ride.
- **FOR COMPETING IN A USDF DRESSAGE SEAT MEDAL SEMI-FINALS**
 - Rider – must have a USDF Participating Membership (PM) to compete in the semi-finals.
 - Owner – must meet minimum competition requirements.
 - Horse – must meet minimum competition requirements.
- Refer to the USEF Rule Book for all rules regarding USEF-licensed competitions.
- Refer to USEF DR133 for complete specifications of the USEF/USDF DSM program.

QUALIFYING FOR THE USDF DRESSAGE SEAT MEDAL SEMI-FINALS

A competitor can qualify for the USDF DSM Semi-Finals by one of two methods.

1. Earning a qualifying score (70% or higher) in any eligible dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) held at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition during the qualifying period of August 1 through July 31. The list of eligible riders who have qualified by score can be found on the USDF [website](#).
 - a. Classes restricted by criteria other than normal dressage rider categories of open, junior, or junior/young rider are not eligible.
 - b. Classes offered as Test of Choice (TOC) will not count.

2. Qualifying for the Great American Insurance Group /USDF Regional Dressage Championships. Competitors who earn the necessary qualifying scores to participate in the regional championships at any level (excluding freestyles), and are otherwise eligible, are automatically qualified to participate in the USDF DSM Semi-Finals. A list of riders qualified for the regional championships is maintained and updated continuously on the USDF [website](#).

PLEASE NOTE: Borrowed horses are permitted in all Dressage Seat Equitation, USDF DSM Semi-Finals and USEF DSM Finals classes. A rider would be permitted to ride a different horse in each of the three phases of the DSM program.

COMPETING AT THE USDF DRESSAGE SEAT MEDAL SEMI-FINALS

- Riders can elect to compete in any one of the nine USDF DSM Semi-Finals.
 - Riders may only compete in one semi-final competition per calendar year.
 - No declaration of region is required, but riders must submit an entry for the USDF DSM Semi-Finals class at the regional championship of their choosing in order to compete.
- Riders are not required to ride in a USDF DSM Semi-Finals class in the same region as they participate in regional championship classes.
- Riders who qualify for the USDF DSM Semi-Finals through the "qualifying for Regional Championships" method, may compete in the DSM Semi-Finals even if they do not compete in the Regional Championships.
- Riders can choose to compete the same horse in a regional championship in one region, and in a USDF DSM Semi-Finals class in another region.
- Borrowed horses are permitted in USDF DSM Semi-Finals classes.
 - For DSM Semi-Final Classes and DSM Finals Classes, which are held during the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships and USEF Dressage National Championships respectively, competitors **must** comply with all Championship rules pertaining to horses entered in Championship classes, including but not limited to the rule that only the rider entered in the Championship class may ride that horse. Borrowed horses that are only entered in open (i.e. non-Championship) classes at these shows are not subject to the one-rider restriction.
 - Refer to the USDF website for complete rules pertaining to the [regional championships](#) and the USEF website for complete rules pertaining to the [USEF Dressage National Championships](#).
- There are two age divisions in the USDF DSM Semi-Finals
 - 13 and under: A rider is eligible for the 13 and under Semi-Final class until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 13 (DR 133.2 (f)).
 - 14 through 18: A rider is eligible for the 14 through 18 Semi-Final class from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches 14 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 18 (DR 133.2 (f)).

NOTE: Riders will compete in the USDF DSM Semi-Finals and the USEF DSM Final in the respective age group in which they qualified (refer to DR 133.2 (d)). For example, if a rider is age 13 at the time of their qualifying ride, but is age 14 at the time of the USDF DSM Semi-Finals, they will compete in the 13 and under division. If that rider is one of the top two riders who move on to the USEF DSM Final, they would also ride in the 13 and under division in that competition.

COMPETING AT THE USEF DRESSAGE SEAT MEDAL FINALS

Refer to USEF Rule DR 133 and the USEF website for complete rules regarding the USEF DSM Finals classes.

CBLM Qualifying Rules

1. A horse/rider team qualifies as a team, and only the same team may compete at the Finals.
2. The rider must be a member of a participating USDF GMO dressage association at the time of qualification.
3. To be eligible to compete in the Finals in a given level, the horse must not have been shown before Oct. 4, 2018 in any test two levels above that level in shows licensed by the USEF, the FEI or any other National Federation. Exception: Riders who have never shown two levels above their Finals level may ride experienced horses.
4. The rider is responsible for submitting a form as proof of qualification to the Championships Secretary as soon as possible after the qualifying ride. (Qualification Form available on www.CBLM.org and from Bettina Longaker, entries@scriptrides.com). Please include your email address. No rider will qualify until the Secretary receives a properly filled-out qualification form. The Secretary will confirm qualification by a qualification list on the official CBLM website. Only riders who have NOT qualified will be individually notified.
5. Competitions may not charge extra fees for qualifying rides.
6. ANY class offered that is a CBLM test will be designated as a qualifying class.
7. Only those competitions listed on www.CBLM.org calendar will be used as qualifying competitions. Over a period of four days or less, no more than two qualifying competitions may be held at the same location.
8. Winning horse/rider teams at the Finals will be ineligible to compete at the same level in succeeding years, except for Intermediate II, Grand Prix, Grand Prix Freestyle and Pas de Deux.
9. The 2020 Finals classes may be used to qualify for 2020 and the FS and FEI Finals may be used to qualify for the USDF/GAIG Finals (except Training level FS) in 2020.
10. The last date to qualify for the 2020 Finals is September 9, 2020.

Qualification Requirements:

CBLM Age for all Levels: is determined by the age of the rider as of December 1: Children = 12-14; Junior = 18 & under; Young Rider = 19-21; Senior = 22 and older.

USEF levels: The horse/rider team must achieve the following minimum percentages (qualifying tests to be used are indicated):

Training Level Test 2	65% (Seniors/YR)	63% (Juniors)
First Level Test 2	62% (Seniors/YR)	60% (Juniors)
Second Level Test 2	62% (Seniors/YR)	60% (Juniors)
Third Level Test 2	62% (Seniors)	60% (Juniors/YR)
Fourth Level Test 2	62% (Seniors)	60% (Juniors/YR)

FEI levels: A horse/rider team must achieve the following minimum score in any FEI class at a qualifying show (National and CDI); FEI TOC classes may be used.

Grand Prix	60%	

Freestyles: The Qualifying score is 63%. At the Finals, there will be seven freestyles. 1) Training Level; 2) First Level; 3) Second Level; 4) Third Level; 5) Fourth Level; 6) Intermediate I; 7) Grand Prix. Any type of freestyle class from a USEF licensed competition will be accepted, including GAIG/USDF qualifying classes, USDF or FEI freestyles, or CDI freestyles.

Pas de Deux: The Qualifying score is 65%.

CBLM Age is determined by the age of the rider as of December 1: Children = 12-14; Junior = 18 & under; Young Rider = 19-21 years.

Children Riders MAY qualify using the FEI Children Team or Freestyle tests for the Second Level Finals. They will compete at the CBLM Finals in Second Level Test 2 and/or Second Level Freestyle.

Young Riders will use the SENIOR qualifying score for TRAINING, FIRST and SECOND levels and MUST compete in their respective SENIOR division for TRAINING, FIRST and SECOND levels.

Junior Riders ONLY will compete in the Junior Division for TRAINING, FIRST and SECOND levels.

Junior & Young Riders will compete together for THIRD and FOURTH levels.

FEI Intermediate II ONLY may be used to qualify for 2020.

Division A riders may ride in Division B, but Division B riders may NEVER ride in Division A at the Championships.

Regardless of the Division entered, only ONE Level per entrant (A or B, not both) may be ridden at the Championships.
