Helmet Safety Standards

A separate test focuses on the helmet's harness strap to assure that it remains in place during a spill. The helmet is placed on a head form "with realistic human bone structure," explains Malavase, "and then weighted and dropped." The straps must hold the helmet on the head without stretching beyond a certain amount.

All helmets are retested for concussion and retention after being frozen to minus-20 degrees, heated to over 120 degrees and submerged in water overnight. If the helmet still transfers no more than 300g and the strap is still effective, that design earns ASTM/SEI approval.

"With all we put riding helmets through around the barn," says Malavase, "we have to know that they are still going to protect us."

Effective 12/1/08: the USEF has increased the length for allowable whips.

Where whips are permitted, a whip no longer than 47.2 inches, including lash, may be carried (was 43.3 inches since 2004).

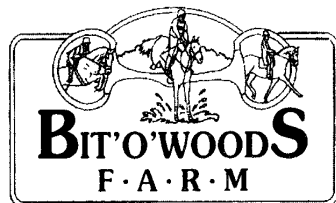

Riding Helmet Safety Standards Explained

Just what does the label "ASTM/SEI-certified" on your riding helmet mean?

The label "ASTM/SEI certified" has become commonplace in safety helmets over the years, but few riders know what the acronyms stand for, let alone what's required to earn this seal of approval.

The American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) is a century-old organization that writes safety standards for everything from artificial playground surfaces to firefighters' suits. The ASTM draws up testing procedures and safety requirements for each item, standards that can then be adopted by individual organizations, such as the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF).

Once the standards are in place, the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI) ensures that they are followed by manufacturers, who do their own in-house testing or contract the testing out to other laboratories. SEI representatives periodically visit labs to audit procedures, and twice in the first year (and annually thereafter), the organization sends batches of helmets to an independent certified testing lab.



To earn certification, all protective helmets (including bike, hockey and equestrian models) are dropped onto a flat anvil from a height of about six feet, and from several angles and directions. A second anvil test is designed with the particular risks of the sport in mind.

"For equestrian testing, the second anvil has a very sharp corner that the helmet is dropped on," says Dru Malavase, who has served on the ASTM's equestrian protective-headgear committee since 1984. "This is just like the impact the side of a jump or a horse's hoof would have."

Computer sensors measure the shock from the fall that is transferred to the inside of a helmet in terms of gravity force (g).

"The threshold at which the most serious head injuries occur is 300g," says Malavase, "so all helmets must be under that -- and not even the tiniest bit over."

Toby is a 12yr. old 16.3h full Friesian mare with a long black mane past her shoulders and full feathers. She was started at Los Alamos by Gail Carmona three years ago and has been longed and lightly ridden since. I kept her as a brood mare but she is not in foal and in need of a serious rider to enjoy her and bring her along in the show ring. She is still very green but very willing. She has a great temperament and handles well on the ground and on the trailer.

Hell's Angel Off the Track Thoroughbred Grant in Education

Several years ago, I developed and sponsored this grant in honor of my beloved OTTB Hell's Angel (Bobbie). The grant money is to be used solely for dressage instruction by a dressage judge or certified dressage riding instructor.

In the first year, the grant was awarded to a member of the Lehigh Valley Dressage Association in Pennsylvania. This past year, the grant was awarded to one of our own ECRDA members, Nicole Rettino and her OTTB Irish Lore (Erin).

Nicole and Erin used the grant to continue their dressage education with Vicki Rickabaugh of Blue Spruce Farm Dressage Center. They achieved a 67.391% for the Starter Rider Walk/Trot/Canter Senior division. Erin is Nicole's third OTTB, but the first one exclusively dressage trained. Their ultimate goal is to compete at Grand Prix.

Nicole says "Erin's spirit is infectious, her loyalty heart-warming. She has accepted her new career in dressage whole-heartedly, with the courage that her breed is known for."

My long standing goal is to see the OTTB recognized nationally as a safe, sound and competitive adult amateur mount. Thanks to Nicole and Erin for their hard work and ability in helping to achieve this goal. I look forward to seeing them in the Grand Prix ring

and, who knows, perhaps one day competing at Dressage at Devon.

Hell's Angel Thoroughbred Rescue Award

Are you currently competing an off-the-track Thoroughbred? Would you like your horse's accomplishments recognized? Then apply for the Hell's Angel Thoroughbred Rescue Award! This award is being offered for a seventh year, and will be awarded at the 2009 ECRDA year end banquet.

The Hell's Angel Thoroughbred Rescue Award has been created to recognize the accomplishments of Thoroughbreds who have come off the track, and their people who have taken their time and talent to rehabilitate and retrain these kind and gifted athletes.

To apply for this award the following criteria apply:

1. The TB must have raced, even if just one race (does not have to have raced in this country),
2. You must be an ECRDA member.
3. You must submit a copy of your horse's race track record to Lisa Rasmuson at 1277 Smithville Road Bordentown, NJ 08505. Contact The Jockey Club at (800) 333-1778, (606) 224-2800, or on the web at www.equineline.com, if you need your horse's record.

Check the fit of your riding helmet: Make sure the helmet fits snugly all the way around. Wiggle it back and forth and side to side; when it moves, your scalp (and your eyebrows) should move with it. If it slides freely, you need a smaller size. If it squeezes uncomfortably, go up a size.

Check the shape your riding helmet: If the helmet squeezes your brow but still rocks freely side to side, it's too round for your head; if it fits at the sides but rocks back and forth, it's too oval. Many helmets come with fitting pads you can slip into the inside hatband to solve these problems. For example, if the helmet is too round, put a pad on each side. Or, try a different style with a more or less oval shape.

Check the brim of your riding helmet: The helmet's brim should rest 1/2 to one inch above your eyebrows. If it sits higher, you're not getting full protection; any lower, and it could obscure your vision. Some helmets can be adjusted (with lacings or foam pads) to rest lower or higher. Or, try a style with a deeper or shallower crown.

Smart Headgear - Riding Helmets

Four tips to help you ensure that your riding helmet fits correctly

Every rider, at every level, falls off at some time, so look for a helmet that's ASTM/SEI certified. ASTM is the American Society for Testing and Materials, which sets standards for helmets; SEI is the Safety Equipment Institute, which certifies that helmets meet those standards.



Even the best safety helmet won't protect your head if it doesn't fit properly. And a bad fit can be dangerous, especially if the helmet slips down, blocking your vision. Here are four fit tips:

Put your helmet on right: Make sure the helmet is level--the visor shouldn't tip up or down. If you have long hair, tie it back at the nape of your neck--don't shove it under the helmet, or you'll get a poor fit. Fasten the harness, making sure it's comfortably snug.

So if you compete at USDF recognized dressage competitions and you are a member of the North American Thoroughbred Society (NATBS), you may also qualify for the Hell's Angel Thoroughbred Rescue Award that I sponsor there. This is part of the NATBS USDF All Breeds Award program. You and your horse must meet all requirements for a USDF All Breeds Award. As well, the horse must meet the criteria of having raced at least one race.

But what about all the wonderful, dedicated riders at Training Level? ECRDA believes they deserve to enjoy the fun, too. In fact, ECRDA has been offering year end awards for Training Level Musical Freestyle for many years using the USPC format.

This year ECRDA has issued our own ECRDA Training Level Musical Freestyle score sheet. This test will be eligible at all ECRDA schooling shows and the ECRDA Championship show. A copy is presented on pages 10-11 and will be posted on the ECRDA web site.

Consider trying a Musical Freestyle this year. For competition or just for fun, you'll have a grand time.
